are looking at ways to safely worship together, we are well aware that many people are vulnerable in our congregation.

 We ask you to remember to support your church in ways that you are able during this unexpected season in our world. Please mail your checks to the church address. Thank you!

Worshipping in the Building

Because we also seek to care for the most vulnerable, and in consultation with the Presbytery, these are the guidelines for gathering together again:

- 1. We will also use DialPad (the new name for UberConference) so that those who are not able to join in person can join via their phones. The phone number is: 269-215-0384
- 2. Masks are *mandatory* for everyone when we meet.
- 3. We are asking that when you come to the church building that you go straight to your seat in the sanctuary and enjoy music and pray.
- 4. We will sing with masks on.
- 5. There will be no eating or drinking (we know that we all will miss this!)
- 6. As difficult as it is, we are asking that there be no hugging or shaking hands, as we (again) care for the most vulnerable.
- 7. Regarding the use of restrooms, we are asking people to please be courteous in caring for others in this time of uncertainty. We

- will supply wipes so that when someone uses the room, they can wipe things down before and/or after.
- 8. After worship we ask that you gather outside to greet each other.

Prayer and Praise on Thursdays @ 6 pm

Beginning this Thursday we will gather for Prayer and Praise at 6 pm, just like we did at the beginning of the pandemic. We gather for less than 30 minutes so that people can have dinner. This is a time to connect, to pray, sometimes for song, sometimes to read Scripture. We look forward to joining together via Dialpad! Connect just like you do on Sunday mornings. You will receive a call at 6 pm and answer the phone if you would like to join!
